

Everybody's Talking

Noisy neighbours The new neighbours of Dominique Douthe, who lives in the Landes region of southwestern France, are very annoyed. Unique cheese A creamy delicious cheese made in Sweden is called Västerbottensost. Well-loved by many, this cheese is made in the village of Burträsk, in the northeastern part of the country. Interestingly, Burträsk is the only place where this cheese can be properly made. The dairy tried to expand its production of Västerbottensost to other locations in Sweden, but the cheese crafted elsewhere didn't taste the same. Many legends and rumours explain why this is so, but no one actually knows, so the mystery remains.

To the rescue A dog and koala bear were rescued from a mine shaft near Ipswich in Queensland, Australia, by emergency services personnel, who were called to the scene by the dog's owner. The owner thought her pooch might have been chasing the koala when both fell into the derelict shaft. The team of rescuers couldn't go down the shaft due to the danger, so they used ropes and safety nets. 

NOTICE OF SETTLEMENT APPROVAL

Did you experience gender or sexual orientation-based harassment or discrimination while working or volunteering with the RCMP?

You may be eligible for compensation.

On March 10, 2020, the Federal Court approved a class action settlement concerning allegations of gender and sexual orientation-based harassment and discrimination of women working or volunteering with the Royal Canadian Mounted Police ("RCMP"). The settlement provides for six levels of compensation ranging from \$10,000 to \$220,000.

Recipe of the month
Summer Fruit and Mascarpone Tart
 2 x 320g ready-rolled all-butter puff pastry
 100g icing sugar
 750g tub mascarpone
 600ml double cream
 2 tsp vanilla extract
 200g raspberries, a few halved
 200g blackberries, a few halved
 1 large mango, peeled and thinly sliced
 6 nectarines or peaches, a mixture, sliced
 4 passion fruits (look for ones with crinkly skins - they're ripe), halved, seeds and pulp scooped out
 handful small mint leaves
 Prep: 30 mins. Cook: 30 mins Level: Easy Serves: 15-18
 1. Heat oven to 200C/180C fan/gas 6. Unroll 1 pastry sheet, but leave it on the parchment. Place it on a baking tray, dust with 2 tbsp icing sugar, then cover with another sheet of parchment and another baking tray. Pour baking beans into the tray to weigh it down, or use empty cans. Bake for 30 mins, then check if the pastry is golden all over. If not, return for another 5 mins or so. Repeat with the other pastry sheet (or cook both together if you have enough trays). Once out of the oven, trim the edges with a large, sharp knife. Leave to cool.
 2. Softly whip the mascarpone, cream, vanilla and remaining icing sugar, then transfer half to a disposable piping bag fitted with a 1.5cm round nozzle (or just snip off the corner). Pipe blobs of the mascarpone cream over the surface of one piece of pastry, right up to the edges. Top with half the fruit and dust with a little icing sugar.
 3. Top with the second piece of pastry, more mascarpone cream (refilling the bag when you need to), the remaining fruit, a dusting of icing sugar and, finally, some mint leaves. Use a serrated knife to cut through the layers.
