Recipe of the month

Candy Cane Double Chocolate Cookies

4 oz (120g) semisweet chocolate
1/2 cup (113g) butter
2 large eggs
1 cup (200g) sugar
1/2 tsp (3g) mint extract
1 cup (125g) all-purpose flour

1/2 cup (60g) cocoa powder, unsweetened
1/2 tsp (3g) salt
1/2 tsp (3g) baking soda
6 oz. (170g) semisweet chocolate, chips or chunks
4 or 5 crushed candy canes

Level: Easy Total Time: 27 mins Yield: Approx. 30 cookies

- 1 Preheat the oven to 325 F (165 C). In a medium bowl combine the flour, cocoa, baking soda and salt. Set aside.
- 2 Melt the butter and 4 oz of semisweet chocolate together over low heat or bain-marie. Remove from heat and let cool slightly.
- 3 Combine the eggs and sugar and beat at medium speed with a hand mixer until light and fluffy, about 3-5 minutes. Add the chocolate mixture and stir until well combined. Add mint extract.
- 4 Add the flour mixture and stir until just combined. Fold in the chocolate chips or chunks.
- 5 Drop 1 tablespoon portions 2 inches (5cm) apart onto a baking sheet lined with parchment paper.
- 6 Sprinkle crushed candy canes on top of each.
- 7 Bake for 10-12 minutes—they should be slightly underbaked so the interior stays chewy and soft.
- 8 Let the cookies cool on the baking sheets until the cookies are firm enough to remove, probably another 5-10 min. While cookies are still warm, add on top of each some extra crushed candy canes to get a beautiful look. Cool completely on a wire rack.

Recipe of the month

Cream Cheese Penguins

18 jumbo black olives, pitted
 1 (8 oz.) package cream cheese, softened
 18 small black olives
 1 carrot

Prep: 30 mins. Total: 35 mins Yield: 18 penguins

- 1 Cut a slit from top to bottom, lengthwise, into the side of each jumbo olive. Carefully insert about 1 teaspoon of cream cheese into each olive. Slice the carrot into eighteen 1/4 inch thick rounds; cut a small notch out of each carrot slice to form feet. Save the cut out piece and press into centre of small olive to form the beak. If necessary cut a small slit into each olive before inserting the beak.
- 2 Set a big olive, large hole side down, onto a carrot slice. Then, set a small olive onto the large olive, adjusting so that the beak, cream cheese chest and notch in the carrot slice line up. Secure with a toothpick.
- 3 Add scarves and hats by using fresh red pepper strips, or canned pimentos cut into different shapes.
