

Unusual art: Artist Reijo Kela of Finland must have been a bit bored when he decided to make some friends literally. He came up with an art installation consisting of over 1,000 "people" made of wooden frames and dressed in colourful clothing. All the figures, which have heads of peat and hair of straw, face the same direction. Called "The Silent People," the installation is situated in a field near a highway, in the Finnish municipality of Suomussalmi. 




