Loyal pet: A Russian woman named Svetlana is not able to leave her pet husky at home. It is a favourite of art teacher Zhao Wenrui of Shanxi Province, China. The finished product took him three months and covers eight chalkboards and, like the original, reveals the lives of the people of the time, from farmers to vendors to boatmen, along with an amazing array of landscapes.




