

Table for one: During the COVID-19 pandemic, social distancing has been the norm. That's why restaurants have closed in countries around the world. However, a Swedish couple decided to try their hand at offering a safe dining experience. Linda Karlsson and Rasmus Persson, from the rural village of Rans ater, opened Bord för en (which is Swedish for "table for one"). They set up a table in a field for one person to dine, and sent the food to the guest in a basket, via a rope from the kitchen to the table. 


