Disguised buns: A schoolteacher who lives in Ho Chi Minh City, Vietnam, has a hobby that is drawing attention. She likes to bake, and one of her specialties is steamed buns—with a twist! Once the buns are made, she decorates the outside to make them appear to be tangerines. When people see one, they want to pick it up and peel it. 
