Disguised buns: A schoolteacher who lives in Ho Chi Minh City, Vietnam, has a hobby that is drawing attention. She likes to bake, and one of her specialties is steamed buns—with a twist! Once the buns are made, she decorates the outside to make them appear to be tangerines. When people see one, they want to pick it up and peel it. Recipe of the month

Spring Pea Pasta

- | | |
|------------------------------|--------------------------------------|
| 1 pound pasta | 2 lemons – zest and |
| 3-4 cups fresh peas | 1/4 cup juice |
| 5 scallions, thinly sliced | 2 cups fresh pea shoots, |
| 1 shallot, very finely diced | baby spinach or arugula |
| 1 cup chopped fresh mint | 1 teaspoon salt (plus more to taste) |
| 1 cup chopped Italian | 1/2 teaspoon pepper |
| parsley | 1 tablespoon truffle oil |
| 1/2 cup olive oil | Optional: goat cheese crumbles |

Prep Time: 15 mins. Cook time: 10 mins. Yield: 4 (main) or 8 (side)

- 1 Boil pasta in a generous amount of salted water per directions.
- 2 During the very last minute of cooking, if serving this as a warm entrée, add the peas to the pasta and just lightly blanch.
- 3 While the pasta is cooking, prep the rest of the ingredients.
- 4 Chop the scallions, shallots and herbs.
- 5 Zest two lemons, and measure out 1/4 cup lemon juice.
- 6 Once the pasta is just about done, add the peas to the boiling pasta water and blanch for one minute, or just until bright green. Immediately drain, place pasta and peas in large bowl, drizzle with olive oil, lemon juice and season with 1 tsp salt and 1/2 tsp pepper.
- 7 Toss in the pea shoots (or other greens) and add the scallions, shallot, herbs and lemon zest. Stir.
- 8 Taste, adjusting salt and lemon juice, adding more of both, if necessary.
- 9 Drizzle with truffle oil; serve immediately.

If making this as a pasta salad, rinse pasta and peas in very cold water to stop the peas from cooking any longer. Add goat cheese right before serving.
