Others feature swirls of foodcoloured dough strands or shapes that are formed into unbelievable patterns. The resulting pies are almost too incredible to eat!

The young man decided to post a video of himself doing absolutely nothing. He shows himself sitting on a couch and staring into the camera for over two hours! 
