

### Everybody's Talking

Different ice cream: The ice cream in Turkey isn't the Western-style cold, smooth scoop in a cone. Called dondurma (which means "freezing" in Turkish), the ice cream in this transcontinental country includes the usual milk and sugar, as well as two unique ingredients: mastic, a resin from the mastic tree; and salep, powdered orchid bulb. The former makes the ice cream stretchy and sticky, and the latter is a thickening agent. Dondurma comes in lots of flavours and doesn't melt as quickly as regular ice cream. One type, called Maras dondurma, uses more salep, and diners use a knife and fork to eat it.

Tall hedge: In Scotland, a huge hedge is deemed to stand higher than any other hedge in the world. Called the Meikleour Beech Hedge, it is located about 90 kilometres (56 mi.) north of Edinburgh near the village of Meikleour. Standing 30 metres (100 ft.) high and stretching for a length of 530 metres (one-third mile), this hedge has been growing since 1745. It is quite a sight, especially in spring, when light reflects on its new green leaves, and in fall, when it turns to rust and gold. The hedge is trimmed about once every 10 years, requiring the efforts of four workers over a period of about six weeks using hydraulic lifts and cutters.

Fantastic flowers: Stress at her job as a civil engineer drove Luciana Gonzalez to a new career, one she could not have imagined. The Brazilian woman became an artistic confectionery master, making art out of food. Her specialty is making sugar flowers, and her creations look so real that viewers can't believe the bouquets are edible. She did not get into her new job because of a love of cooking; rather, it was because the Senac Campos do Jordão school of gastronomy was nearby, so she took some courses. Although only working for a short time in the industry, Gonzalez has gained a well-known reputation.

Fine art: Using coloured pencils, Australian artist Shaun Mckenzie creates portraits that, when complete, appear to be photographs. Known as NeeYellow on social media, Mckenzie has great patience, working for an average of 60 to 80 hours on each of his pieces. One portrait of Jim Carrey realistically reveals the comedian's iconic grin, while another of actor Rupert Grint, who played Ron Weasley in the Harry Potter movies, seems to show every strand of his messy red hair. This talented artist likes to share some of his tricks on social media, including time-lapse videos that show a portrait coming to life.

## Did You Know...

**Rock and wire:** A gabion wall is used by landscape architects and home designers. It is a container made of wire that is filled with materials like rocks or stones. They are easy to make and last a long time.


