**Glow in the dark:** An American artist with a love of photography and black light found a new canvas to create images: the human body. John Poppleton uses UV body paint in a dark studio to create incredible scenery and imagery on the backs of his models. He paints balmy sunsets, purple clouds, rolling waves, and shimmering waterfalls that glow luminously under black light. Viewers describe the results as magical. He was once a wedding and portrait photographer and uses his extensive photography experience to prepare his surreal pieces.







Light the way: The Fisgard Lighthouse, located near Victoria, British Columbia (Canada), started guiding boats into Esquimalt Harbour in 1860. Automated in 1929, the lighthouse is still operating today and is a National Historic Site.


