

Watermelon Steaks with Warm Pickled Shrimp 1 cup apple cider vinegar ½ cup plus 2 tablespoon extra-virgin olive oil, divided tablespoon plus ½ teaspoon kosher salt, divided 2 teaspoons coriander seeds, lightly crushed medium-size red onion, thinly sliced medium jalapeño, thinly sliced (2-inch-thick) watermelon round (from the centre of 1 large seedless watermelon), quarter 1/4 cup fresh flat-leaf parsley lightly crushed 12 ounces peeled and deveined leaves Lime wedges, for serving tail-on raw large shrimp Prep Time: 25 min. Yield: 4 servings

O Stir together vinegar, ½ cup olive oil, 1 tablespoon salt, and coriander seeds in a medium saucepan; bring to a boil over high. Add shrimp, onion, and jalapeño. Cover pan, and remove from heat, let stand 20 minutes, stirring once after 10 minutes.

O Meanwhile, preheat grill to high (450°F to 500°F). Brush watermelon quarters with remaining 2 tablespoons oil, and sprinkle with remaining 1/2 teaspoon salt. Place watermelon on grill grates, and grill, uncovered, until slightly softened and grill marks appear, about 4 minutes per side. Transfer to a platter.
