

1 medium-size red onion, thinly sliced 1 medium jalapeño, thinly sliced 1 (2-inch-thick) watermelon round (from the centre of 1 large seedless watermelon), quartered 1/4 cup fresh flat-leaf parsley leaves cup apple cider vinegar 2 cup plus 2 tablespoon extra-virgin olive oil, divided tablespoon plus ½ teaspoon kosher salt, divided taappoons coriander sade 2 teaspoons coriander seeds lightly crushed 12 ounces peeled and deveined leaves Lime wedges, for serving tail-on raw large shrimp Prep Time: 25 min. Yield: 4 servings Prep IIme: 25 min. Yield: 4 servings
O Stir together vinegar, ¹/₂ cup olive oil, 1 tablespoon salt, and coriander seeds in a medium saucepan; bring to a boil over high. Add shrimp, onion, and jalapeño. Cover pan, and remove from heat; let stand 20 minutes, stirring once after 10 minutes.
O Meanwhile, preheat grill to high (450°F to 500°F). Brush watermelon quarters with remaining 2 tablespoons oil, and sprinkle with remaining 1/2 teaspoon salt. Place watermelon on grill grates, and grill, uncovered, until slightly softened and grill marks appear, about 4 minutes preside. Transfer to a platter. Using a slotted spoon, top watermelon wedge evenly with pickled shrimp mixture. Spoon a few tablespoons of pickling liquid over top of each, and garnish with parsley. Serve immediately with lime wedges



Moose cheese: There's specialty cheese, and then there's moose cheese. Because milking a moose is a slow and cautious process, moose cheese is some of the most expensive cheese








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
