Slippery soap: A silky bar of scented soap is always nice to have in the shower, but a soap maker in Lebanon has taken that idea several steps further. The family-owned Bader Hassen & Sons factory in Lebanon, makes exclusive skincare products, but perhaps none more so than its Khan Al Saboun brand of soap. One expensive bar costs about \$2,800 (USD), because it contains gold and diamond powder, along with olive oil, honey, essential oils, and fragrance. It gives new meaning to the phrase, "Don't drop the soap in the shower!"

Big fight: It must have been a whopper of an argument! An Italian man and his wife, who live in a town north of Milan, Italy, had a spat one night. 


