Terence Jackson Jr. calls his creation Luxury Strike Bowling. A two-lane bowling alley is built inside the trailer of a 53-foot (16-metre) semi-truck. The inside is decorated with colourful lights, a theatre screen, and elevated seating. The game played is "duckpin," which employs shorter lanes and lighter weight balls than the five- or 10-pin varieties. The bowling-alley-on-wheels is available for parties and events.




