He got the idea while watching a boat from an airplane window. He named his creation "Zip-Fastener Ship" and presented it at the 2020 Designart Tokyo, calling his installation "Opening the River."

Delicious stew: Those who have visited Brazil may be well aware that this South American country's national dish is a stew called feijoada (feijoada completa). This hearty meal consists of smoked pork and flavourful black beans. Finding exact replicas of the dish throughout the country is difficult because families and dining establishments boast their own homemade recipes for the popular mealtime favourite. 


