Everybody's Talking

Vintage look: Mila Povoroznyuk, a young woman from Vinnytsia, Ukraine, has long been interested in women's clothing from the late 1800s and early 1900s. Now she has turned that interest into an everyday thing by always wearing vintage clothing from that era. She started by occasionally wearing the clothes, but she soon found herself feeling more comfortable and confident in the old styles. She sews some of the items herself and finds other pieces in secondhand stores. The clothes include long dresses, corsets, and elegant hats. Many modern folks must be interested in vintage fashions because her social media account has thousands of followers.

Glowing tattoos: Those who want to get a tattoo, but want to be discreet about it, might consider being inked with a black light tattoo. While not immediately invisible, the tattoo will eventually fade so that it can only be seen in UV light. They'll glow nicely at a rave dance party where black lights are featured, but the colors will be hidden from work associates the next day at the office. Some people add UV paint to a regular tattoo, while others may choose a tattoo that is drawn completely with UV paint. Doting on deer: Deer are revered animals in Japan, and to prove it, a beautiful event takes place on winter mornings in Nara Park in Nara, south of Kyoto. Over 1,000 tame deer live in the park, and they enjoy interacting with the many tourists who come to see them. The best time to view the deer is during the event called Shikayose, which means "deer-gathering." That's when a French horn player stands in the middle of the park and plays Beethoven's Sixth Symphony. Hearing the music, the deer come from all corners of the park to obtain the acorns offered to them.

Hidden station: The city of Toronto, Ontario (Canada), has a subway system that commuters regularly use. It has a hidden and now-abandoned section that was only used for six months in 1966, called the Lower Bay Station. This sits underneath the Bay Station on the city's Yonge-University subway line. When it was built, planners had hoped to have a useful addition to the line, but instead it became an awkward loop. Now, Lower Bay Station is inaccessible to the public because the entrances have been bricked over. There are unmarked doors to this mysterious underground place, which is occasionally used for training purposes and film shoots.

Did You Know...

Recipe of the month

Chocolate Covered Strawberry Christmas Trees

12 ounces dark green candy melts
1 pound of strawberries, stems removed
24 Oreo cookies
white icing
sprinkles
candy stars

Icing:
2 1/2 cups powdered sugar
3 tablespoons heavy cream
Add water by the teaspoon and whisk until the desired consistency is reached. You want it to be thick like toothpaste.

Prep Time: 15 min. Cook Time: 10 min. Yield: 24

- Set a heat proof bowl over a small pot of simmering water on the stovetop (double boiler). Slowly melt the candy melts in the bowl, stirring occasionally. Do not allow moisture to come in contact with the candy.
- Spoon or pipe a small amount of icing onto the top of each Oreo. This will adhere the strawberry to the cookie base.
- Once candy melts are fully melted, turn the heat to low while you dip the strawberries using a toothpick inserted into the cut end.
- Shake off excess candy coating gently. Using a second toothpick inserted into the pointed end of the dipped strawberry, carefully place the strawberry on top of the icing on the Oreo.
- Decorate with sprinkles and a candy star while the candy coating is still wet. It will usually dry in about 10 minutes.
