Living on water: The Netherlands is known for an engineering ability that makes flood-prone areas livable. Waterbuurt-West is one of those creative ideas. Meaning "water quarter," Waterbuurt is a subdivision of floating homes on Lake Eimer in Amsterdam's IJburg development zone. There are more than 50 of these dwellings, which are actual homes, not houseboats. They won't float away because they are anchored to steel mooring poles; they only move up and down, not sideways, when the tide changes. The material used is light steel and wood, and they have basic but attractive living areas, kitchens, and outdoor patios.




