Heart-shaped lakes: In an oasis called Al Qudra, near the city of Dubai, United Arab Emirates, is a manmade attraction called Love Lake. As seen from the air, Love Lake beckons visitors to its two heart-shaped lakes that intertwine. Desert surrounds the lake on all sides. Recipe of the month

Savoury Winter Soup

- | | |
|---|--|
| 2 pounds ground beef | 1 cup each diced carrots and celery |
| 3 medium onions, chopped | 1 cup fresh or frozen cut green beans |
| 1 garlic clove, minced | 1 cup cubed peeled potatoes |
| 3 cans (10-1/2 ounces each) condensed beef broth, undiluted | 2 tablespoons minced fresh parsley or 2 teaspoons dried parsley flakes |
| 1 can (28 ounces) diced tomatoes, undrained | 1 teaspoon dried basil |
| 3 cups water | 1/2 teaspoon dried thyme |
| | Salt and pepper to taste |

Prep Time: 20 min. Cook Time: 6 hours
Yield: 14 servings (3.5 quarts)

- In a large skillet, cook beef and onions over medium heat until meat is no longer pink. Add garlic; cook 1 minute longer. Drain.
- Transfer to a 5-qt. slow cooker. Stir in remaining ingredients. Cover and cook on low until vegetables are tender, 6-8 hours.
