Better late than never: A librarian got a pleasant surprise when an overdue library book was returned. Jo Sennett, who works in the St. John Fisher Catholic High School library in Peterborough, Cambridgeshire, England, could not believe what arrived in the mail: a book called Manners Make a Difference, with a note of apology from an unidentified borrower. The book was 32 years overdue! That did not faze Sennett, who thought it was delightful that the person went to the trouble of giving it back after all these years. The library doesn't plan to try to collect the 832 Pounds owed in late fees.

Runaway bull: Some ranch hands had to use their best roping skills to capture a stray bull who escaped from his trailer. The men were near Murray Bridge, South Australia, on their way to Alice Springs in the country's Northern Territory, when the incident occurred. #### Valentine's **Pop Hearts**

Prep Time: 10 min. Cook Time: 13 minutes Yield: 4

Preheat the oven to 425 degrees F. Line a jelly-roll pan with parchment paper.

② Unroll the piecrust and cut into 8 rectangles or hearts. Use a small heart-shaped cookie cutter to stamp out smaller hearts from half the hearts (these will be your peekaboo top crusts); brush edges with egg.

Spread 1 heaping teaspoon raspberry jam in the centre of the 4 solid hearts. Put the peekaboo crusts on top; seal the edges by crimping them with a fork (lightly floured, if needed). Transfer to prepared jelly-roll pan. Bake 10 to 13 minutes or until

golden. Transfer to wire racks to cool. Forego the store bought chocolates and impress you Valentine with these treats
