Better late than never: A librarian got a pleasant surprise when an overdue library book was returned. Jo Sennett, who works in the St. John Fisher Catholic High School library in Peterborough, Cambridgeshire, England, could not believe what arrived in the mail: a book called Manners Make a Difference, with a note of apology from an unidentified borrower. The book was 32 years overdue! That did not faze Sennett, who thought it was delightful that the person went to the trouble of giving it back after all these years. 
Did You Know.


