

### Everybody's Talking

Better late than never: A librarian got a pleasant surprise when an overdue library book was returned. Jo Sennett, who works in the St. John Fisher Catholic High School library in Peterborough, Cambridgeshire, England, could not believe what arrived in the mail: a book called Manners Make a Difference, with a note of apology from an unidentified borrower. The book was 32 years overdue! That did not faze Sennett, who thought it was delightful that the person went to the trouble of giving it back after all these years. A motorist had noticed it wandering around, was concerned for its safety, and called for help. The police put the animal in a vacant cell for the night, where it slept comfortably. The owners, who were found the next day, were grateful that the young member of their flock had found a safe place to spend the night.






