Bottled message: A little Canadian boy found a truly remarkable treasure under a pine tree in his yard. The resort is able to offer this experience because it runs an onsite butterfly farm, where visitors can watch the "Belizean Blue" butterflies at all stages of their life cycle.

Samet Wahyudi, who works in Brebes, named his son after his place of employment: Statistical Information Communication Office. 
