Everybody's Talking

Bottled message: A little Canadian boy found a truly remarkable treasure under a pine tree in his yard. Nyima Mitchell, who lives with his family in Chéticamp on Cape Breton Island, Nova Scotia (Canada), discovered an old bottle lying on the ground. He pried off the bottle's cap, and inside was a letter written on a crumpled piece of paper. Dated August 12, 1995, the author was a then-teenage girl, Nellie Nadeau, who had tossed the bottle into the St. Lawrence River while on vacation. After some investigation, the Mitchell family was able to track down Nadeau in Alaska. Excited that her message in a bottle was found, she hopes to one day meet her new pen pal.

Surfer's surprise: Australian Danny Griffiths loves to surf big waves like those found off the southern coast of Tasmania, where he lives. Once, when surfing with friends, he had to ditch his specially made green surfboard. Usually a ditched board would be easy to locate, especially with its bright green colour, but this time Griffiths could not find it. Four years later, tourists to Tasmania mentioned to locals that fishermen had found a green board 2,700 kilometres (1,700 miles) away off the coast of North Queensland. When he looked at a photo, Griffiths knew the board was his, which made him happy. None of the replacement boards he'd used since then were as good as the lost one.

Butterfly blue: When people book rooms in luxury hotels, they can expect certain amenities, such as chocolates on the pillows, a delicious breakfast, or a free massage. But the Chaa Creek eco-resort in Belize has raised the bar: on each room's coffee table sits a glass box with a cocoon inside, and guests can watch a beautiful blue morpho butterfly emerge. Awestruck visitors are provided with instructions on how to safely release the butterfly into the wild. The resort is able to offer this experience because it runs an onsite butterfly farm, where visitors can watch the "Belizean Blue" butterflies at all stages of their life cycle.

Samet Wahyudi, who works in Brebes, named his son after his place of employment: Statistical Information Communication Office. Their first baby, a girl, ended up with a more conventional name, but when a boy came along later, the couple stuck to the plan. However, they nicknamed him "Dinko" to make things easier for everyone.

Recipe of the month

Easter Bunny Treats

1/3 cup vanilla frosting
36 large marshmallows
36 miniature marshmallows
Red and pink heart-shaped decorating sprinkles

Small black nonpareils
White sprinkles
Pink coloured sugar

Total Time: 15 min. Yield: 1 dozen

- 1 Place frosting in piping bag.
- 2 For each bunny, cut 2 mini marshmallows in half and use frosting to attach them to a large marshmallow to form arms and legs. For the face, attach 2 mini marshmallow halves for cheeks. Use white sprinkles, black nonpareils and heart-shaped sprinkles to form whiskers, eyes and nose.
- 3 For the ears, cut a large marshmallow in half diagonally. Dip each sticky side in coloured sugar and use frosting to attach the ears to the top of the large marshmallow.
- 4 Use frosting to connect the 2 large marshmallows; let stand until dry.
