Monkey business: A sneaky little Patas monkey found a way to escape from his enclosure at the Taipei Zoo in Taiwan. The farmer moved the stone border marker that had been sitting in place for over two centuries because it was in the path of his tractor. A local historian noticed that the stone had been moved 2.29 metres (7.5 feet), making Belgium a tiny bit bigger and France a wee bit smaller. The situation caused a few laughs between area politicians, who said that as long as the stone is moved back to its rightful place, no problems should arise.




