

Everybody's Talking

Shoe stealer: A Japanese man has been arrested twice for stealing a peculiar kind of treasure: women's shoes. Tsunehito Isobe of the city of Murakami likes to hoard women's shoes, whether they are nurses' footwear, sandals, or high heels. His recent arrest came after the cops found almost 140 pairs of shoes in his home. An office building's surveillance camera caught him in the act, leading to his arrest. The last time he'd gotten caught was seven years earlier, when he was found with over 200 pairs of shoes that he had stolen, mostly from health institutions. However, the culprit didn't steal every pair; sometimes he bought them from used clothing stores.

Exhilarating climb: A huge, smooth, towering rock is part of the landscape near the towns of Guatapé and El Peñol in the region of Antioquia in Colombia. Situated about 70 kilometres (44 miles) east of the city of Medellín, it is called El Peñón de Guatapé or La Piedra del Peñol. (Peñón means "rock.") All around this landform are rolling hills, plains, forests, and lakes. It juts up from the land in a spectacular fashion, rising 200 metres (656 feet) high. It is possible to climb to the top on a wooden staircase constructed in a natural fissure that runs straight up the side of the rock. The climb may be a tad scary, but the views from the top are breathtaking.

Bird friend: People who live in Gommenec'h, in northwestern France, don't bat an eye when they see Xavier Bouget riding his bicycle with a pigeon resting happily on his shoulder. That's because the pigeon, named Blanchon, is Bouget's friend. The unlikely relationship started in 2019 when Bouget rescued Blanchon (then just a chick) after she fell out of her nest. The retired man used a syringe to feed the chick, and as she grew, she stayed with her rescuer, even though she is free to fly away if she wishes. Bouget believes that Blanchon trusts him, and that is why she stays around, keeping him company as he gardens, cycles, or works in his backyard workshop.

Endless books: The architects of a bookstore in Sichuan province in southwestern China must have tapped into a love of books when designing the interior space. Called Dujiangyan Zhongshuge, this store holds more than 80,000 books, but at first glance, visitors would think the collection was endless. That is because strategically placed mirrors, a black tile floor, a spiral staircase, and high archways all work together to give the illusion that the stacks of books never end. Those wandering the hallowed halls of the place know, of course, that mirrors are creating the effect. But even so, identifying the spot where the real books end and their reflections begin can be a challenge.


