Everybody's Talking

Home for bees: Bees are important to the environment because they are pollinators. In China, where the native bee population is in danger, a special bee sanctuary exists. It's in the Shennongjia Nature Reserve in the central part of the country, where a steep cliff accommodates about 700 wooden boxes that the bees use as their hives. Beekeepers tending to the boxes must also use them as steps to reach the hives further up. To access the topmost hives, the keepers use ropes. The steep cliff is an ideal spot because it is inaccessible to bears. The area has diverse flora, as well, so the bees have many places to forage for pollen.

Tear-down project: Folks in the town of Blumberg, Germany, had better be sure to pay their contractor, at least if the contractor is someone known as Matija P. While building an apartment block, this fellow had run into problems getting the developer to pay for his work. Instead of taking the issue to court, Matija P. hopped onto a huge excavator and started dismantling the very facade he'd just finished building! In the process, he damaged about 30 apartments that tenants were about to occupy. The contractor stopped his act of destruction when the excavator broke down. Later, he turned himself in to police. He is likely to be fined and will possibly end up in jail.

Not a doctor: A teacher at Shude University of Science and Technology in Taiwan is not just a good teacher, he's good at drawing, too. Zhong Quanbin uses chalk and a ruler to produce amazingly detailed blackboard drawings of parts of the body: eyes, skeletons, muscles, and more. Although not a doctor, nor even interested in becoming one, Zhong Quanbin's skill in art brought him so much attention that he was hired at the university to teach medical students how to draw anatomically correct body parts from different angles. The name of the course he teaches is "Anatomy Illustrations and Drawing Skills."

Exam fraud: Those who want to graduate from high school need to write their own exams. A young couple in Diourbel, Senegal, learned this the hard way. Khadim Mboup dressed up as a woman and attempted to write high school graduation exams on behalf of his girlfriend, Gangué Dioum. Mboup wore a dress, wig, scarf, and earrings, and he put on makeup, too. Unfortunately for the couple, an exam supervisor became suspicious and called the police. Mboup had no choice but to confess to his actions, explaining that he did it to help Dioum, who isn't fluent in English. The couple may now be barred from taking the exam for five years.


