

Everybody's Talking

Swinging crane: Coming and going from Minami-daitojima Island (also known as Daito Island) is an experience like no other. This island in Japan's Okinawa archipelago has raised coral reefs on all sides, so docking a boat is not possible. Boats can moor about four to six metres (13-20 ft.) from the shore, and then a crane's cage swings people to land. Some travelers think this is fun, while others think it's scary. On nice days, the crane company loads people into a roofless cage, and an enclosed cage is used in the rain. There is one other way to get there, people can hop aboard one of two daily flights that land on the island.

Up, up, and away: It's a bird, it's a plane, it's neither of these things! Rather, it is a sky full of hundreds of balloons! That is what locals and visitors alike get to see in Albuquerque, New Mexico (U.S.), during the Albuquerque International Balloon Fiesta each October. In a single launch, over 500 balloons of all shapes, colours, and sizes adorn the sky, which is breathtaking for those watching from below. The event lasts for nine days. In addition to balloon launches, spectators can see chainsaw carving contests, skydiving performances, fireworks, and lots of musical entertainment.

Emerald green: At the mouth of China's Yangtze River, on the island of Gougi in the Shengsi archipelago, is a fishing village that looks beautiful but is actually deserted. Lush, green vegetation grows over the buildings. Tourists can now visit abandoned hamlets on Gougi, such as Houtou Wan Village, a stunningly preserved, mosscovered ghost town. While other islands in the archipelago boast a thriving and diversified industry, this village has been left in nature's care. With vines blanketing the structures, streets, and steps, Houtou Wan Village is a beautiful green, just like the surrounding hillside.

Prized burger: What a list of ingredients! A Dom Perignon champagne bun with gold leaf, Japanese A5 Wagyu beef, smoked duck egg mayo, white truffle, king crab, and beluga caviar are just a few of the delicacies found in what has been dubbed the world's most expensive burger. Called the Golden Boy and made by Robbert Jan de Veen of the Dutch restaurant De Daltons, this decadent burger sold for almost 5,000 Euro. Jan de Veen wasn't greedy in his quest: he donated the proceeds to charity. His restaurant, located in the town of Voorthuizen, Netherlands, is ready and willing to make more burgers in the hopes of attracting wealthy burger connoisseurs.


