Foxy pet: A family in Peru purchased a dog they believed was a purebred husky, but had to give up their pet pooch because the animal turned out to be an Andean fox. Bought from a store in the city of Lima, the "puppy," named Run Run, had been settling in nicely. Owner Maribel Sotelo insisted that Run Run seemed the same as any other new pup: he played happily and was not aggressive. That is, until he got old enough to be interested in nearby chicken coops! After the neighbours complained, Sotelo called a wildlife service to investigate. Identifying the animal as a fox, authorities decided to release Run Run into the wild.

Mystery spring: Fosse Dionne is an ancient spring in the Burgundy region of France. Located in the small town of Tonnerre, Fosse Dionne has been used for various purposes since Roman times, such as a drinking water source or as a public bath. Each second, 311 litres (82 gallons) of water flow from it, and even more at rainy times. A stone rim, built in the 1700s, surrounds a pit fed by the spring. Something unique about Fosse Dionne is that its source is unknown. despite several unsuccessful attempts to trace it. In recent years, a professional diver managed to get further into the spring's limestone depths than anyone before him, but still could not locate the source.

Scottish culture: On the Isle of Lewis, the northernmost of Scotland's Outer Hebrides islands off the country's west coast, is a fellow known on social media as the "Hebridean Baker." A few years ago, the baker, whose real name is Coinneach MacLeod, began posting videos of himself making family recipes, such as hot toddy choux buns, haggis bon bons, cupcakes, and cookies. He also adds stories and music to accompany the process, and sometimes his pet, a Westie named Seòras, makes an appearance. His goal is to introduce the world to the best Hebrides customs and to the food of his home.

Book return: When the Baltimore County Public Library system in Maryland (U.S.) decided to abolish late fees for unreturned books, a surprising number of overdue tomes started arriving in its book shoot. When library users knew they wouldn't have to pay fines, they came out in droves, with books in hand. One returned book, Jubilee Trail by Gwen Bristow, even had a due date of 1957, and another book had been due in 1983. Fines were deemed unfair to users who may not be able to afford them. Plus, having a fine due on an unreturned book could cause folks to refrain from using the library for study or leisure reading.

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
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

Did You Know...
