Devon -

Everybody's Talking

Big tater: A couple from a farm near Hamilton, on New Zealand's North Island, unearthed a potato they named "Doug." While weeding their garden, Colin Craig-Brown and his wife Donna discovered the gigantic tater. All lumps and bumps, it weighed 7.9 kilograms (17.4 pounds). The pair had to use a pitchfork to excavate the enormous vegetable. At first, they didn't know what they'd uncovered. They only use ordinary fertilizers to help their garden, and so they were bewildered by the size of the potato. The couple is talking to the folks at Guinness World Record to see if their potato could beat the current 4.9-kilogram record holder

All the same: People all around the globe are familiar with the experience of attempting to cut a cake, pie, or pizza into equal portions so that all diners receive the same amount. Getting the slices to be the same size is hard. Students from Kundong High School in the Oita Prefecture of Japan have found a way to do it. They designed an award-winning device that figures out the angle the cut needs to be, based on the number of slices necessary to feed the party of eaters. The student group called their device, "Get Along Well With Everyone." It uses a laser beam to direct the server where to make the cuts to obtain equal-sized pieces.

Underground swim: If visitors know where to look, they can enjoy a soak, sauna, and swim in a charming but hidden public bathhouse in Stockholm, Sweden. Called Storkyrkobadet, the bathhouse is located in the basement of a building dating back to the 1700s. Once used as a convent, the building later became a primary school. The area that is now the bathhouse has been used in the past as a wine cellar and for coal storage, with a pool added later, along with sauna, showers, and lockers. The route to Storkyrkobadet involves a narrow, cobblestone street, but visitors are rewarded with the piece of history, along with a relaxing swim.

Small guarters: Travelers who need a place to stay while visiting Colorado (U.S.), and don't mind a spot without much floor space, could stop in the town of Lyons and check out the WeeCasa Tiny House Resorts. There, guests can choose to rent one of 23 reasonably priced "tiny houses," each with a different theme. For example, the Gnome Home, which was designed after a Hobbit home in Lord of the Rings, has a front door in the shape of a circle. The houses are not all the same size or shape. Some are really tiny at 170 square feet (15.8 square metres), while a larger one is 418 square feet (38.8 square metres). The company also has locations in Tennessee and South Dakota, and plans more tiny house resorts soon.


