Everybody's Talking

Sparkly crime: The glitter is what gave them away. Police were able to pin a crime on two Florida (U.S.) women because the sparkly stuff was all over the inside of their car. The crime was burglary. Sarah Franks and Kaitlin O'Donovan had an argument with a man named Jacob Colon, who was standing on the balcony of his apartment in the city of Clearwater. One of the angry pair got into Colon's apartment, tossing glitter all over the place. With a licence plate number, the authorities traced the women to their home, where they found the car with glitter inside. Franks and O'Donovan face felony charges for the incident.

Fun with food: Japanese artist Gaku can eat his art after creating it. This is because he makes art out of food. He uses an X-Acto knife to carve intricate designs into all kinds of vegetables and fruit, including apples, broccoli, zucchini, lemons, avocados, and more. He might cut the food item in half first, and then carve elabourate geometrical patterns into the flesh. Other times, he'll carve the designs in the skin of the food. He's been known to turn a broccoli spear into an eagle and has etched a cartoon character into a banana. He shoots photos of his creations before the food spoils, and then eats them if he is so inclined.

Human shape: On the Italian island of Sicily, not far from Mount Etna, a small town named Centuripe has an interesting shape when observed from the air. While viewing the town on Google Earth, photographer Pio Andrea Peri realized that Centuripe, which is perched on a hill, looked like a person with outstretched arms and legs. He decided to take photos with his drone to try to reproduce this sight. But his drone couldn't get high enough to take pictures of the whole town, so he had to use several images and piece them together. The night shots are especially interesting because the lights of the town stand out from the black surroundings

Insect phobia: What better way to get over a fear of insects than to face them every day. Michael Amoia of New York City did just that by covering most of his skin with tattoos of insects and bugs. In fact, he has 864 tattoos of insects, plus spiders and millipedes, one of which is 17 x 19 inches (43 x 48 cm) and another is 50 inches (127 cm). A spider and web are under his arm, a dragonfly perches on his temple, and a gigantic fly graces his foot. Amoia has earned a place in the Guinness World Records book for this feat, which he began almost 30 years ago when he was 21. His first bug tattoo was a red queen ant on his forearm.




