



Ingredients

1 (12 ounce) - package dried rice noodles
1 tsp. - vegetable oil
1 - onion, finely diced
3 - cloves garlic, minced

- 2 cups diced cooked chicken breast meat
- small head cabbage, thinly sliced
- 4 carrot, thinly sliced

RECIPE PREPARATION

- ${f 1.}$ Place rice noodles in a large bowl; cover with warm water and let soften for 8 to 10 minutes. Drain and set aside.
- 2. Meanwhile, heat oil in a wok or large skillet over medium-low heat. Add onion and garlic; cook and stir until onion is tender, about 3 to 5 minutes. Stir in chicken, cabbage, carrots, and soy sauce. Cook until cabbage begins to soften. Toss in noodles and cook, stirring constantly, until
