Monkey land: In a village called Upla, in the Osmanabad district of India's Maharashtra state, monkeys are so well respected that they have been given their own land. Along with a small population of humans, Upla has about 100 Rhesus macaques in residence. Some years ago, the village set aside 32 acres of land and put them in the name of all the monkeys. 

Honey Glazed Chicken



1/4 cup - honey

2 tbsp. - soy sauce

1/8 tsp. - red pepper flakes

2 - skinless, boneless chicken breast halves, cut into bite-size pieces

RECIPE PREPARATION

- 1. Whisk honey, soy sauce, and red pepper flakes in a bowl; set aside.
- 2. Heat olive oil in a skillet over medium heat; cook and stir chicken in hot oil until lightly brown, about 5 minutes.
