Summer Squash & Basil Pasta

Ingredients
1/4 cup - Olive oil
8 - Garlic cloves, thinly sliced
2 lbs. - Assorted summer squashes and zucchini, quartered lengthwise, sliced
- Kosher salt (to taste)
1 tsp. - Aleppo-style pepper, plus more for serving
12 oz. - Paccheri, ziti, or other large tube pasta
1/2 cup - Reserved pasta water (save more if needed)
1/2 cup - Parmesan, grated, plus more for serving
1 tbsp. - Fresh lemon juice
1/2 cup - Basil leaves, divided

RECIPE PREPARATION

1. Heat oil in a large skillet over medium. Cook garlic, stirring occasionally, until very lightly browned around
2. Add squash, increase heat to med-high; season with salt. Turn down heat once it begins to stick, continue until squash is jammy and soft, 12-15 minutes.
3. Toss in Aleppo-style pepper.
4. Meanwhile, cook pasta in boiling, salted water until very al dente. Transfer to skillet with squash.
5. Add 1/2 cup reserved pasta water
6. Add Parmesan in stages; add more pasta water if needed until sauce coats pasta and pasta is al dente.
7. Toss in lemon juice and most of the basil. Divide pasta among bowls and top with more Parmesan, Aleppo-style pepper, and remaining basil.
