Life by the water: Anyone wanting to live in a unique, wateraccessible community might consider Het Brekkense Wiel in the Netherlands. The area's name means "The Broken Wheel" in Dutch. Located between IJsselmeer, which is the largest lake in the country, and the Frisian Lakes, this neighbourhood was built in 1992. Near the water sport destination town of Lemmer, the design of this residential area is similar to its namesake. The 230 homes are arranged in a configuration that looks like a collection of broken wheel halves. The neighbourhood's design means all of the multi-family structures have access to water frontage, as well as roads that provide access by car.






