Ingredients

ripe bananas, mashed 2 cups - oats

2 tbsp. - peanut butter 1 scoop - protein powder, or

to taste (Optional)

1 dash - ground cinnamon (Optional)

RECIPE PREPARATION

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C).

2. Mix bananas, oats, peanut butter, protein powder, salt, and cinnamon together in a bowl.

3. Drop tablespoonfuls of banana mixture 2 inches apart onto a nonstick baking sheet.

4. Bake in the preheated oven until golden, about 15minutes. Transfer to a wire rack; let cool, about
