Lit up lobes: An American fashion designer named Diana Caldarescu has come up with a novel idea that is turning the lights on, literally, in the jewellery industry. She created earrings that look like tiny chandeliers, compete with crystals and brass candleholders. They attach to the ear using a wrap rather than the usual stud or clip. Rare fig tree: Bacoli, a city on the west coast of Italy, is home to ancient ruins called Parco Archeologico delle Terme di Baia.
