Lit up lobes: An American fashion designer named Diana Caldarescu has come up with a novel idea that is turning the lights on, literally, in the jewelry industry. She created earrings that look like tiny chandeliers, compete with crystals and brass candleholders. They attach to the ear using a wrap rather than the usual stud or clip. 


