Good food: Different regions of the world have their own iconic street foods. In North America, vendors serve hot dogs out of trucks, and in England, hungry folks can usually find a fish-andchips seller. On the Caribbean island country of Guadeloupe, the most famous street food is bokit. It is a sandwich famous for its bread: crispy, delicious, and fried. Did You Know...
