

Ingredients

8 oz. - rotini pasta

1 lb. - lean ground beef

1 - small onion, diced

28 oz. - jar spaghetti sauce

4 oz. - sliced pepperonisausage

2 cups - shredded mozzarella cheese

RECIPE PREPARATION

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). 2. Bring a large pot of lightly salted water to a boil. Add

pasta and cook for 8 to 10 minutes or until aldente; **3.** In a medium skillet over medium-high heat, cook

beef with onion until beef is brown. Drain. Combine beef mixture with spaghetti sauce, pepperoni and cooked pasta and pour into a 9x13inch baking dish. Top with mozzarella.

4. Bake in preheated oven for 30 minutes, until cheese is melted and golden.
