

Grainy home: Living in a grain silo doesn't seem like a comfortable option, but one near Odessa, Washington (U.S.), may appeal to outdoorsy people. She might sew a sunburst of yellow stitches around an oval hole, or cover an imperfection with a patch shaped like a guitar or something else that holds personal meaning for the owner. The artist has held well-attended workshops in the area for likeminded people to learn the skill.

Flowery hair: How would you like to have your hair formed into a lily or a chrysanthemum? If so, a hair stylist for you is Nguyen Phat Trí of Vietnam. Although he has a degree in biotechnology, the stylist knew he had a knack for the arts that he needed to pursue. After studying makeup and hairdressing, he started experimenting with floral hair designs, which can take a couple of days or more to complete. He first sketches the design, finds raw material, and finally works with real hair. Many of his customers are bridal parties, who want unique hairstyles for the special day. Celebrities also like his services.
