Everybody's Talking

Underground accommodation: Wales is home to a hotel that is purported to be the deepest in the world. Aptly named the Deep Sleep Hotel, it is located in an abandoned slate mine in the Snowdonia mountains. At 1,375 feet (419 m) below ground, getting there is quite an adventure for overnight guests. Guided by a trip leader, they have to hike for 45 minutes on mountain paths. Then, they are suited up with gear and taken down a challenging descent path in the mine. After that, they settle into very comfortable cabins and are provided with an expedition-style meal. The next day, staff members wake the visitors for the steep trek back up to the surface.

Shoddy work: In a village in India's Maharashtra state, residents have every right to complain about poorly done work. Folks in Karjat-Hast Pokhari had been looking forward to getting blacktop installed on the area's rough roads. So they were thrilled when a construction company arrived to do the work. However, the residents soon realized that the company had taken a huge shortcut in the job: they put down canvas material, then covered it with a very thin layer of asphalt. Several locals soon realized the situation when they lifted up a corner and it folded like a carpet. Villagers have made complaints against the contractor and the government department that hired them.

White line fever: The town may be small, but its authorities decided to fight hard to encourage speeding motorists to slow down. Baune, located in western France, sees many motorists speed over its streets as they navigate through the town's crossroads. Despite clear speed limit signs, drivers pay no heed and drive as fast as 100 km/h (60 mph) through the small town of 1,700 residents. To try to remedy the situation, the town painted confusing road lines. The continuous lines go this way and that, and often overlap. Drivers are slowing down to try to figure out what they are supposed to do. Hopefully motorists won't go back to their old ways anytime soon

Long race One ultramarathon starts from the pier in Santa Monica, California (U.S.), and ends at the welcome sign to the city of Las Vegas, Utah. Called The Speed Project, the length of the run is 340 miles (548 km) through the area's hot deserts, including Death Valley. The race is not advertised, there are no rules, and the participants must be invited to compete. Runners do not have to follow a particular route, but they are not allowed to run on highways. Started by Nils Arend and Blue Benadum in 2013, the race can be run solo, but it started out as a relay race for six team members


