Wild picnic: In Brazil, adventurous diners can enjoy their food while suspended over an enormous waterfall. A company called Rota Aventura has all the equipment set up for the experience, which includes a picnic table dangling on metal cables above Cascata da Sepultura, a large waterfall in the country's southern state of Rio Grande do Sul. Customers are carefully strapped onto the table, which is then rolled out on the cables. 




