Windy ride: For a bike ride, most people choose a calm day with not much wind to slow them down. However, anyone who likes windy rides might enjoy participating in the Dutch Headwind Time Trial Championship. Participants all ride the same type of bike: upright and with only one speed. They ride an 8.5-kilometre (5.3-mi.) course located on the Oosterscheldekering storm barrier near the southwest city of Vrouwenpolder, Netherlands. The race originated in 2013 and is only held during storms when winds are expected to reach up to 120 km/h (74 mph). Only 300 participants are allowed, and the winner is the rider who completes the course with the fastest time.

Running away: Lots of young kids hate doing their homework, but most would choose to do their school work over being sent to an orphanage. Not so for a school boy in Chongqing, China. He was so angry at his mother for pestering him to do his homework that he went to a local police station to complain. He told the police that he wanted to go to an orphanage instead of living at home. The officers helped him calm down, got his address, and contacted the parents. With the father on the way, the officers had a little chat with the boy to convince him that returning home was a better choice.

Perfectly round: In the U.S. state of Florida is a lake so round that pilots gave it the nickname "Silver Dollar Lake." Officially called Kingsley Lake, it is located in the northeastern part of the state. The flocks of people who visit the lake on the ground may not be able to see its round shape, which is obvious from the air. The perfectly round shape is not artificial, but was formed by an ancient, spring-fed sinkhole. Ringing the lake are houses and cottages, all the way around the 2-mile (3.2-km) wide lake, which is 90 feet (27.4 m) deep at its centre. The homes have docks for swimming and boating.

Fruit artist: Someone looking at the flowers sculpted by Vietnamese artist Nguyen Thi Thu could be forgiven for not realizing that the blooms emerge from papaya fruits. She has been practicing this traditional art for many years, with a 15-year break when she moved to another country where green papaya was not readily available. Glad to be back in Hanoi, she picked up the art again. This time, along with sculpting primroses, lotuses, and water lilies, she challenged herself to create many different types of chrysanthemums, which is a complicated process. The artist shows her work at public events, and she also teaches classes to show others the delicate art of sculpting papaya.
