Everybody's Talking!

Impolite parrots: Most of us are brought up being told to "mind our manners." Somehow, a flock of eight parrots at Lincolnshire Wildlife Park in eastern England did not get the message. 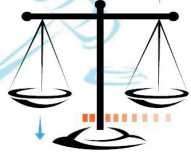

Recipe of the Week

Chicken Cordon Bleu

- 6 skinless, boneless chicken breast halves
- 6 slices Swiss cheese
- 6 slices ham
- 3 tablespoons all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon paprika



- 6 tablespoons butter
- 1/2 cup dry white wine
- 1 teaspoon chicken bouillon granules
- 1 tablespoon cornstarch
- 1 cup heavy whipping cream

RECIPE PREPARATION

Pound chicken breasts if they are too thick. Place a cheese and ham slice on each breast within 1/2 inch of the edges. Fold the edges of the chicken over filling and secure with toothpicks. Mix flour and paprika in small bowl and coat the chicken pieces. Heat the butter in a large skillet over medium-high heat and cook the chicken until browned on all sides. Add wine and bouillon. Reduce heat to low, cover, and simmer for 30 minutes, until chicken is no longer pink and juices run clear. Remove toothpicks and transfer breasts to warm platter. Blend cornstarch with cream in small bowl and whisk slowly into skillet. Cook, stirring until thickened and pour over chicken. Serve warm.
