Pretty in pink: A woman from Romania loved trucks so much that she decided to become a driver. But in the maledominated industry, the woman, whose name is Georgeta, wanted to show her femininity by decorating her truck the way she desired: in pink! Seeing things: Most people who are thinking about getting a tattoo don't consider an image in 3D. But that's what a tattoo artist from Portland, Oregon (U.S.), has started to make famous. 





Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). In a medium-size mixing bowl, mix barbecue sauce and pineapple preserves together. In a medium-size mixing bowl, combine meat, breadcrumbs, eggs, onions, salt, and parsley. Mix well and form into bite-size balls. Arrange the balls in a single layer in a 9x13 inch baking dish. Pour the barbecue sauce mixture evenly over the meatballs. Bake for 30 to 45 minutes, until the meat is cooked.
