Everybody's Talking

Pretty in pink: A woman from Romania loved trucks so much that she decided to become a driver. But in the male-dominated industry, the woman, whose name is Georgeta, wanted to show her femininity by decorating her truck the way she desired: in pink! As trucking companies would not be amenable to such a colour scheme, Georgeta bought her own truck and is now working for herself. Her truck has a pink paint job, both inside and out. Seeing things: Most people who are thinking about getting a tattoo don't consider an image in 3D. But that's what a tattoo artist from Portland, Oregon (U.S.), has started to make famous. 
