Skyward rent: The steep rental market in Vancouver, British Columbia, Canada, pushed Tim Chen to a creative solution in his living arrangements. Hernández's message concluded with a touching note to the young boy, urging him to proudly wear his space-themed clothes and aspire to join NASA one day.


