## Everybody's Talking

**Short snoozes:** Underneath the chins of chinstrap penguins is a thin black band that gives them their distinctive name. Protecting their nests from predators like brown skua birds is vital, but challenging, for the penguins. To combat the threat, they've adopted a unique sleep strategy. These penguins take thousands of "microsleeps" every day, but each only lasts for about four seconds. By monitoring the penguins' brain activity, researchers have been able to confirm this behaviour. Remarkably, the birds can keep up this sort of sleep schedule for weeks on end. While scientists aren't certain if these brief naps provide any deep rest, the naps do enable the penguins to safeguard their offspring.

Heartfelt gesture: At Providence College in Rhode Island (U.S.), students forged a bond with their dorm's overnight security guard, whom they affectionately know as "Unc." The students recognized his kindness and knew he was longing to see his family in Nigeria after over a decade away from home. So they rallied to fund a trip for him. Their GoFundMe campaign garnered support from thousands within only a day. When they presented the overwhelming \$3,000 (USD) amount to James Mogaji, he shed tears of gratitude. The emotional moment spread through an online video, showcasing the impact of communal kindness. The security guard knelt in prayer, demonstrating the impact of the students' compassion.

**School surprise:** In a quaint town in Minnesota (U.S.), Catie Zwier is a beloved kindergarten teacher who envisioned her students playing a role in her wedding. As it happened, her wedding day coincided with Catholic Schools Week, a week of themed dress-up days, so she and her fiancé devised a plan. The teacher seized the opportunity to plan a "Fancy Surprise Day" at the school, unbeknownst to the children. That day, amid the eager faces of her students, the couple exchanged vows in the presence of their school family. Initially, the children were shocked, but soon they erupted into excited applause. From flower girls to readers, the students were integral to the ceremony.

Lucky cats: The 19 feral cats that roam the National Palace, which is the presidential home in Mexico City, have been a fixture for years. They even wander into rooms where meetings or television interviews are taking place. The palace is built on the same ground as the former palace of the Indigenous Emperor Moctezuma, whose ancient empire honoured dogs, not cats. The Mexican president recently declared the cats as "living fixed assets," the first animals to receive such an honour. This means that they will receive food and care for life. They are now considered a symbol of the National Palace.




