## Everybody's Talking

Digital David: A team from an Italian university has unveiled a remarkable 17-foot replica of Michelangelo's famous sculpture of "David." The replica was created using cutting-edge, 3D-printing technology, and is being hailed as the most accurate rendition yet. Unlike the Renaissance sculptor's three-year labour, this team achieved their feat in a matter of a few months. The process involved thousands of digital scans and innovative construction methods. Weighing in at 1,200 pounds (544 kg), the reproduction boasts a weight 10 times lighter than the marble original. Dubbed a "digital twin," this tech marvel hints at a new era of cultural preservation.

Culinary clues: In Italy, a team of researchers continues to uncover the mysteries of the city Pompeii, providing glimpses into the daily lives of its ancient inhabitants. Among the areas recently revealed is a remarkably well-preserved street eatery, which offers insights into the bustling culinary scene of the city. Pompeii gained fame for being blanketed in debris following an eruption from a neighbouring volcano in 79 C.E. Archaeologists have unearthed various structures, including theatres, hospitals, and approximately 80 "fast-food" joints known as thermopolia. The excavation of this particular thermopolium revealed food offerings and artistic depictions of what would have been served before the city was frozen in time.

**Navigating change:** In a pioneering voyage, a cargo ship embarked from Singapore to Brazil, and introduced a revolutionary sail design in the process. Dubbed the "WindWing," this innovation aims to diminish fuel dependency and minimize pollution in maritime transportation. Inspired by ancient sailing methods, the WindWing capitalizes on wind power, and promises sig-nificant environmental benefits. Initial trials of the 123-foot (37-metre) long sail showcased some promising results: the Pyxis Ocean ship reached speeds of up to 6 miles per hour (9.7 km per hour) using WindWings alone. This new transport tech may well be poised for widespread adoption in the coming years.

Stellar haul: In 2016, NASA launched its OSIRIS-REx spacecraft to embark on a two-year voyage to reach Bennu, an asteroid over 200 million miles (322 million km) away. The spacecraft meticulously orbited Bennu before delicately scooping up dust and pebbles. NASA says the trip by the OSIRIS-REx is the first U.S. mission to collect a sample from an asteroid. Now, a capsule carrying the unprecedented samples from the distant body has come back to Earth. After enduring the scorching temperatures of re-entry, the capsule landed in the desert in the U.S. state of Utah. NASA quickly transported OSIRIS-REx to the Johnson Space Center. Scientists anticipate unlocking valuable insights into the early years of our solar system.




