

Everybody's Talking

Young pilot: Promising aviator Lucien Distler has been soaring through the skies solo since his early years. At just 14 years old, this Oakville, Ontario (Canada), native boldly piloted a Cessna aircraft, marking his independent flight debut. While he was too young to operate a car, he possessed the necessary skills to command an airplane. According to him, achieving such a feat at a young age is entirely feasible with diligent training and determination. Lucien attributes his passion for aviation to his regular attendance at air shows alongside his father, an experience that ignited his fascination with airplanes and flying. Their shared enthusiasm continues to fuel his aspirations in the world of aviation.

Not in vane: A decades-long search for a stolen weathervane is over. Recently, a 114-year-old antique copper weathervane surfaced at Sotheby's in New York, N.Y. (U.S.). The auction house, which maintains a database of stolen items, alerted officials in Hartford, Vermont, who confirmed that it was the one stolen from the White River Junction train station in 1983. The weathervane was modeled after a steam locomotive and coal tender, and was crafted by W.A. Snow Iron Works, Inc. It is considered a valuable historic artifact and a beautiful piece of art. The weathervane will be remounted and returned to Vermont to be enjoyed once more.

Gator grab: When angler Justin Wyrick set out for a typical day of bass fishing, he was expecting nothing out of the ordinary. However, his routine excursion took an unexpected turn when he reeled in a surprising catch, a nearly 4-foot-long (1.2m) alligator while fishing with his brother at a lake north of Knoxville, Tennessee (U.S.). The brothers promptly contacted the local wildlife agency. Officers intervened, safely removing the reptile from the scene. Subsequently, the alligator found temporary refuge at a local zoo until arrangements could be made for relocation to a more natural habitat.

High-tech hoax: A university hopeful in Isparta, Turkey, was apprehended for using an artificial intelligence system to cheat on an entrance exam. The candidate, known by the initials M.E.E., was detected during the test due to his suspicious behaviour. Hidden inside his sneaker was a small router, and he had a highdefinition camera disguised as a shirt button. The AI provided real-time answers via a tiny headset. Turkish authorities have not disclosed full details of the cheating system, but M.E.E. faces jail time and a ban from taking future exams. In the end, it seems his artificial intelligence couldn't outsmart human vigilance.




